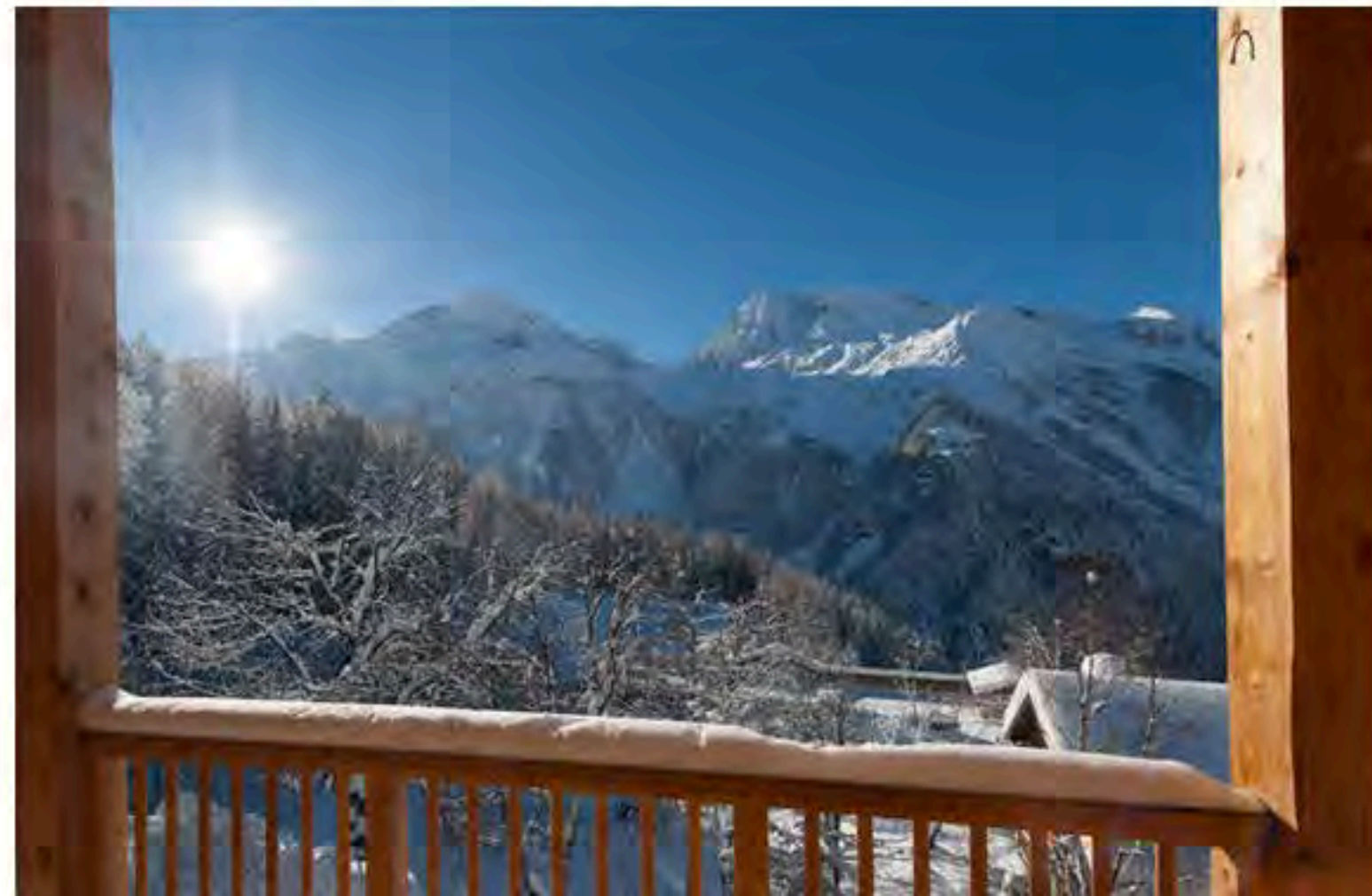

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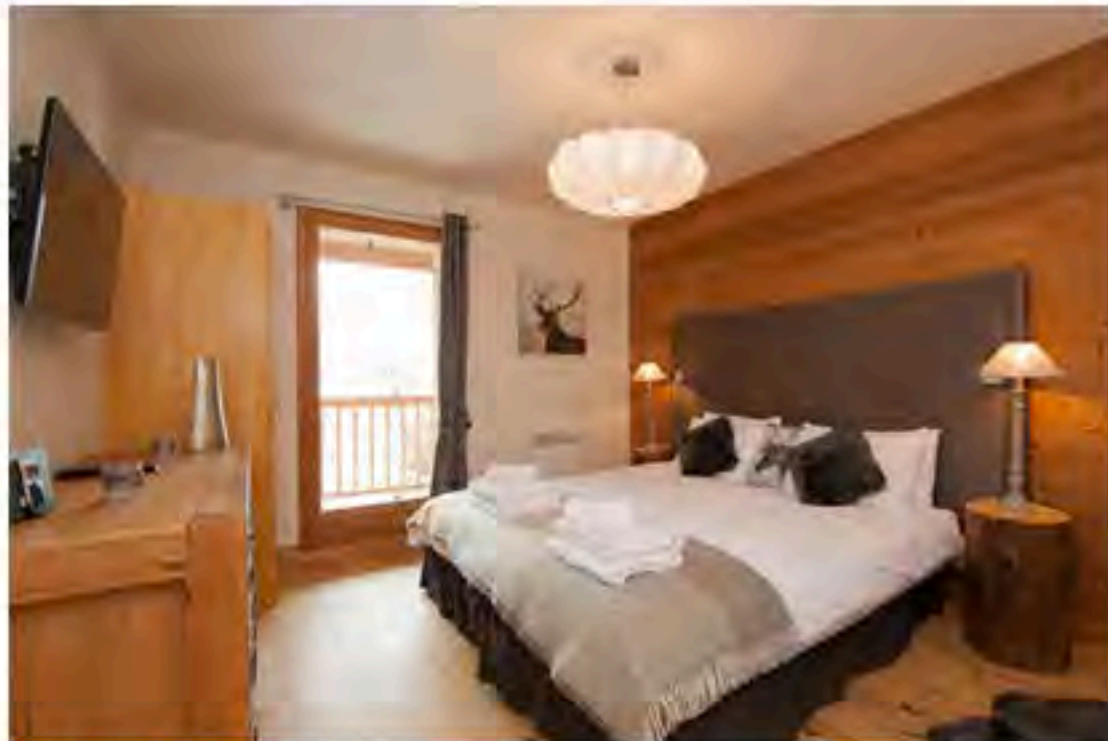


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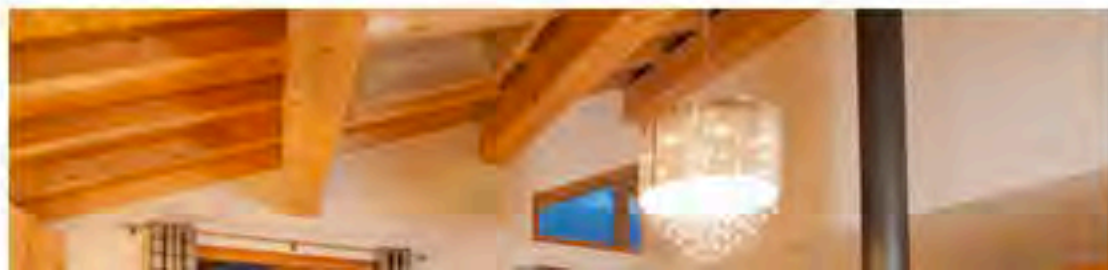
A room with a view might not be the sole reason you stay at La Marquise, but waking up to snow-topped mountains beats the usual grimy streets to be seen out of the windows at ELLE HQ.

Each of the seven rooms (six double/twin and one four-bed bunk) in the chalet is prettily decorated with natural wood, but the only time you'll be in your room will be to sleep.

The shared upstairs open-plan living area, complete with a huge dining table, encourages you to socialise with fellow guests - the chalet is available to book exclusively or room by room. The separate mezzanine-level snug gives an additional area to relax in, complete with board games to bond over.

Best room: Room 4, as it's equidistant to both the boot room and the living area, but all of the rooms have beautiful views of the surrounding mountains.

Best dish: Quail served three ways: confit of leg, breast and scotch eggs.

The living and dining area

The first chair lift in Sainte Foy Tarentaise is just a short stumble away - you can get from your bed to the slopes in less than 15 minutes, especially as there are rarely queues at the lifts. The resort has both gnarly black runs and tamer slopes for beginners, so whatever your skill level, you can swoosh down the slopes **like a pro**. If you want a day off from the slopes, you can get pampered with a treatment in La Marquise's **Elemis** spa treatment room, or go on a guided snowshoe walk around the local area.

Once you've had your day's fill of powdery snow, head back to La Marquise for a decadently lazy evening. The chef, Louise, will prepare the evening's four-course meal while you lounge by the stylish fireplace, or in the hot tub on the balcony. And the chalet hosts, Belle and Louis, will make sure your glass is always full. And as food and drink are included in the price, what more could you want?

Near to? La Marquise is in Sainte Foy Tarentaise, and is just a 20-minute drive from Val d'Isère and La Thuile (Italy), and a 10-minute drive from Les Arcs. Day ski passes for these resorts are available at a reduced rate for holders of a Sainte Foy pass. It's ideal for those who love off-piste skiing.

Getting there: This French Alps location can be reached by flying to Chambéry, Geneva, Lyon or Grenoble ([ba.com](#); [easyjet.com](#)), or by getting the Eurostar/TGV (snow train) to Bourg St Maurice ([eurostar.com](#)). Private and shared transfers can be arranged from these airports/station. It takes around two-and-a-half hours from Lyon or Geneva by car.
